

Todays Gospel centres very much on the Widow's mite, the giving of all she had. The humble widow offered to God all she had, her two small coins. In the Eucharist Jesus really gives himself to us together with all we need to live on. Whose side do we want to be on, the Scribes who gave very little of what they had, or the poor Widow who was content to give to God all she possessed?

Giving which is real giving has a real recklessness in it. The woman may have kept one coin to herself, she gave all! We may feel that we have little to give in the way of material gifts or personal gifts; But there is our Time and Energy we can give and share. This is what so many generous people do in the various ministries they are involved in.

Here in our parish we have so many opportunities, for there are many ministries we can choose. One that I feel should be looked at is, there are a lot of very lonely people living in flats or in their own homes. Not to forget the many Rest Homes that are scattered throughout Wellington. Coming into Christmas and the holiday period is extremely very lonely time for many people as they have no family or relatives visiting. The days are long some people never see people from one day to another. So often they just want someone to call in have a chat and see a friendly face. Very often these people have very little, but what they share is truly wonderful. You leave their homes or rest homes feeling truly blest for all they have shared. The Staff in our Rest Homes are usually short staffed and under a lot of pressure, therefore they are unable to give extra time to many individual people, I know they appreciate when someone calls in, even bringing a pet with them to cheer the residents.

What can we do with this Gospel this weekend? What are our actions? Sometimes we do believe that we can only give away money. Actually there are many more things we can give away. We are encouraged to share our time, our care, our thoughtfulness and our talents with one another. We experience this so clearly in our lives with these current circumstances where people need our physical presence more than money. Our talents can be shared and will be appreciated within our communities where we live our faith. We do all in Christ.

Let us reflect on the image of the widow who gave away everything she had, inspiring us so that whatever we can do for one another or give away for one another, we are giving our Time and Energy.




