

24 November 2024, Solemnity of Christ the King

The contrast between the image of kingship in our first reading this Sunday and the portrayal given to us in our gospel reading could not be more different.

In the first reading, the setting is one of majestic pomp and ceremony; a grand and solemn ritual in which "one of great age" confers sovereignty, glory and kingship on to another whose sovereignty will never pass away, and whose glory and kingship are held in great honour by servants from many races, nations and languages. Whereas, in our gospel reading, the man who claims to be king stands before Pilate, the Roman governor. The man is about to be sentenced as a criminal, considered a rebel against state and religion by his many accusers. The name of the man is Jesus.

This Jesus claims to "bear witness to the truth". And we know Pilate's response to that: "Truth? What is that!" More often than not, in human terms, truth is whatever the boss says it is! Remember Jotham's fable (cf. Judges 9:8-15). The trees gathered to anoint for themselves a king. The trees first offered kingship to the olive tree, then to the fig tree, then to the vine; each giving reasons for their refusal. Finally, the trees offered to anoint the thorn bush as their king. In reply, the thorn bush said, "If you want to anoint me king come and shelter in my shade".

In the context of faith, the king is the one who rules over our hearts. So we are to choose wisely where we are to find "truth". If our truth is firmly anchored in Jesus, the man standing before Pilate, then - using the imagery from Jotham's fable - we will have to come and shelter in his shade; and the truth he bears will indeed have a glorious destiny but not without the shadow and folly of the cross. Why? Because God's wisdom never skirts the reality that, in this life, human beings cannot immunise themselves against suffering. Again, why? Because to truly love and serve another, we will know both joy and sorrow, contentment and regret.

So, we are to choose wisely where we are to find the truth. And, in a quirky way, truth is indeed what the boss says it is. We just have to be oh so careful who we kowtow to as boss, who we choose to be our king!



Remembrance and Recommitment Ceremony (Rā Maumaharatanga) at Korokoro Cemetery

You are welcome to join a peaceful hikoi starting beside the grave of famous chief Wi Tako at the Catholic Cemetery on the corner of Pito-one Street and Korokoro Road on Sunday 1 December 2024. Assemble at cemetery from 1:30pm. Our kaupapa will be to recall and pray for the tipuna interred in this important site and learn about our shared histories. It is also a reminder of the joint kaitiakitanga of this special place, cared for by Wi Tako's descendants, the Love whanau, parishioners from Te Wairua Tapu / Holy Spirit parish, and the Hutt City Council. Wi Tako was buried at Korokoro in 1887 from St Peter and Paul's church in Lower Hutt.

Following the service we will proceed – by foot or vehicle – for 15 minutes to Te Puni urupā in Te Puni Street, then another 15 minutes to Sacred Heart Church, 41 Britannia Street to share stories and a cuppa. Carparking adjacent to Korokoro cemetery. NB: please do not bring food on to the cemeteries, food will be provided at the church.
