

15 December 2024, 3rd Sunday of Advent—Year C

The underlying direction of the Season of Advent is a movement from expectation of the Lord's return, to anticipation of the Lord's immanent emergence in the preaching of John the Baptist, to the manifestation of the Lord's arrival at Christmas: expectation-anticipation-manifestation are the markers that anchor our Advent Season.

In today's gospel reading there are also three markers which point to the way in which the Season of Advent prepares us for the celebration of Jesus' birth. These three markers are found in our gospel reading today in the one question asked three times in succession, "What must we do?" The people asked John the Baptist, "What must we do?" John's answer, "Share what you have". The tax collectors asked John the Baptist, "What must we do?" John's answer, "Be fair in what you do". The soldiers asked John the Baptist, "What must we do?" John's answer, "Be satisfied with what you have": share-be fair-be satisfied, are the three markers which point to how we are to prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth.

These three markers – share-be fair-be satisfied – evoke a feeling of expectancy among the people, an expectancy which John fuels into a frenzy of anticipation by announcing the coming of Promised Messiah whom John feels unfit even to undo the straps of his sandals. We, of course, will celebrate the manifestation of this Promised Messiah at Christmas. This overarching trajectory of sharing, being fair and being satisfied spans the underlying movement of Advent from expectation to anticipation to manifestation. This threefold trajectory of sharing, being fair and being satisfied show us how we make the Season of Advent a period of preparation for the day of Jesus' birth. We are to share what we have. We are to be fair in what we do. We are to be satisfied with what we possess.

But there is also a warning that weaves its way through our Advent movement from expectation to anticipation to manifestation. The Lord's coming will also bring judgement; a judgement that will separate those who listen to him from those who reject him. Like a winnowing-fan, the Lord will separate the wheat from the chaff - a separation that begins with his nativity and ends with his final return when the good (the wheat) will be gathered in, and the bad (the chaff) will be burnt.



The Jesse Tree

During Advent we reflect on how God was revealed to people in Old Testament times before the coming of Jesus. Matthew's Gospel (1:1-17) links the Old and New Testaments. He sets out the genealogy or whakapapa of Jesus' earthly family through which history, knowledge, philosophies and spiritualities were handed down until the birth of Jesus.

The Jesse tree is a visual reminder of this. The name comes from Isaiah's prophecy (Isaiah 11:1) that the Messiah or Saviour would come from among Jesse's descendants. The symbols on the tree are based on centuries of Christian tradition. They are explained further in the Parish App. We will add 4 symbols each week of Advent beginning with the Creation (Earth), Adam and Eve (tree), Noah's Ark, and Abraham and Sarah (stars).
