

9 March 2025, 1st Sunday of Lent

Three great passions motivate our desire: 1. the passion to have; 2. the passion to manage or bring order into our lives; and 3. the passion to be valued. These passions are drives that move us to act for our well-being. In themselves, they are necessary if we are to achieve some sense of contentment. However – and this is the key lesson for this Sunday – if we are not in control of these passions, if we are blindly led by them, they become corrupting influences that distort our desire for happiness. To have becomes greed or a kind of resentful puritanism. To manage or order our lives becomes despotism or an obsessive-compulsive scrupulosity. To be valued becomes conceit or a desperate sense of inadequacy.

Our gospel reading this Sunday proclaims the "No" of Jesus to these three great passions when they control us; when these three passions have turned into corrupting influences.

When the devil tempts a hungry Jesus to turn stone into bread, Jesus answers: "Human beings do not live on bread alone". This is his "No" to the rapacious need to hoard and to a suffocating form of prudery. When the devil tempts Jesus with domination over the kingdoms of the world, Jesus answers: "You must worship and serve God alone". This is his "No" to oppression and to a fear driven anxiety. When the devil tempts Jesus to play Jesus' divinity card, Jesus answers, "You must not put God to the test". This is his "No" to a narcissistic self-regard and to an abject inferiority complex.

In many ways, the first two temptations are included in the final one. Here, the devil tempts Jesus to summon his divinity thereby renouncing or betraying his humanity, destroying the whole purpose of the Word of God becoming flesh which is to save humanity from that most primal of sin: humanity's desire to play God!

Jesus turns the table on the devil and reveals to us how we are to direct our three passions to truly discover our well-being. To have becomes sharing and enjoying in moderation all that is good and life-giving. To manage or order our lives becomes acknowledging our need for others that gives rise to solidarity which, at the same time, enhances our self-confidence. To value becomes esteeming ourselves and others by recognising our limitations and fragility without denying the beauty and the giftedness that is ours as creatures made in the image and likeness of God.

LOOKING BACK, LOOKING FORWARD

ST MARY OF THE ANGELS PARISH

2025

Compared to the recent past, and I am defining the 'recent past' as the five years since my arrival at St Mary of the Angels, 2024 was a quiet year or a year of consolidation. Just think on what has taken place since 2020 when I first became parish priest:

The Covid Epidemic, which first struck in 2020.

The renovation in 2021 of the parish hall and offices in Boulcott St, a \$1 million plus program.

The incorporation of St. Joseph's community into the SMoA parish in late 2021.

The naming of St Mary of the Angels as the National Shrine in August 2021.

The centenary of the St Mary of the Angels church in 2022.

Any one of these events would loom large in the history of a parish, community or organization. No wonder, then, that 2024 pales somewhat in comparison. However, good work was still being done in a number of key areas: catechetical programs for our younger parishioners were well-attended; promotion of the National Shrine continued; research into securing the financial future of the parish was accomplished (though increasing financial constraints on parishioners in a tough economic climate made it imprudent to follow through on the recommendations of the committee); research was also continued in addressing the future of the housing stock owned by the parish; the initiative to create an inter-parochial ministry to the aged, the sick and the dying slowly gathered strength; a small but dedicated ministry amongst young adults took root at SMoA. All these are signs of life and commitment in the parish community. There are no doubt others that I have failed to mention, such as the music ministry (there are 5 different choirs in the parish!), the hidden but sterling work of SVdeP and the Passionist Family Movement. I am sure the list is bigger than I have indicated.

More importantly there are also signs of vibrancy in the numbers attending regular Sunday liturgies (in 1996 the average mass count in November at SMoA was 577, in 2004 it was 604, in 2020, the year of Covid, it was 605 and in 2024 it was 750. For St Joseph's in 2022 it was 146 and in 2024 it was 162). Both churches were literally 'standing room only' in 2024 for the great Feasts of Christmas and Easter. And the RCIA program, averaging about 8-10 candidates a year, surprisingly continues to draw mature people into the Church at a time when our image may be considered tarnished!

In 2025 I would see the following pastoral areas as needing particular attention and effort:

Further raising of the profile of the National Shrine.

Nourishing the Residential Care Ministry.

Supporting the Young Adults ministry.

Increasing the number of parishioners involved as Ministers of the Word and the Eucharist.

Refreshing various parish committees.

The Jubilee Year

Educating the parish re. its weak financial position.

These are the areas the Parish Pastoral Council will be focusing on in 2025/2026. If you wish to talk about these priorities with any member of the council, you will find their photos on the other side of this page.


