

#### 30 March 2025, 4th Sunday of Lent

Our Sunday gospel reading recounts that all too familiar parable of the prodigal son. More often than not the focus is on the prodigal, who only comes to his senses after he had squandered his portion of his father's inheritance on a life of debauchery and now, being destitute, decides to return to his father's holdings to beg his father's forgiveness. This frequent focus on the prodigal should not surprise us. After all, at the root of his Gospel message Jesus reveals the immense love of God for each and every one of us, and how there is more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner than for the many who have never strayed from that love (cf. Luke 15:7). It's an incredibly heart-warming and touching focus.

But heart-warming and touching the focus on the prodigal may be, what is less remarked upon is the sting in the parable, namely, the dutiful son! He had not squandered his portion of his father's inheritance. He had not disobeyed his father's wishes. He had not been a wastrel, even though there were times he had wanted to let loose with his friends. No! He was always the dutiful one! It's this kind of *sting* in the parable that dampens down the warm fuzzies generated by an all too blinkered focus on the father-prodigal son relationship. The dutiful son spikes the warm fuzzies of the father-prodigal rapprochement with a good dose of 'reality TV'. How so? Because the father-dutiful son relationship reveals the heart of the dutiful son who, for all his protestations of respectful obedience not only expects more from his father for having laboured years for him but also reveals beneath that life of duty a smouldering resentment.

We could fob off the resentful, dutiful son as Jesus' symbol for the hardnosed scribes and Pharisees against whom he was directing his parable within the larger context of Luke's gospel, but really?! If truth be told, there is something of the expectation and attitude of the dutiful son in each of us whenever we feel 'passed over', while recognition is given to those whom we consider less deserving! This Lent, we should give time to reflect on the symbol of the dutiful son in each of us, especially when Christian duty belies a smouldering resentment. God's unconditional love will always stick in the craw of those who consider themselves more deserving!

# Support for Lent Appeal is an 'act of generosity'

#### A statement from the Catholic Bishops of Aotearoa New Zealand

Every year in this sacred time, the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference asks Caritas Aotearoa New Zealand to run a six-week fundraising campaign on their behalf called **the Bishops' Lent Appeal**.

Every year, individuals and parishes across New Zealand demonstrate great generosity by donating to this appeal. We hope that this will continue for this Lenten season.

The theme for the Lent appeal in 2025 is **Restoring hope: Your compassion in action / Kia puawai te Tūmanako.** Caritas' mission, as the Catholic agency for justice, peace and development, is of vital importance to us all. The **Bishops' Lent Appeal** is the best way to directly fund Caritas' work – supporting vulnerable communities around the world.

For the Catholic community, Caritas is how we help our brothers and sisters in need, upholding their human dignity through local partnerships grounded in Catholic social teaching.

Over the last few years there has been a drop in giving to Caritas, putting pressure on their ability to fund the programmes that serve those most in need. We ask that during this time of preparation, prayer and almsgiving, you make a special donation to the **Bishops' Lent Appeal 2025** at <u>caritas.org.nz/lent</u> or by using the envelopes provided at Mass.


