

Today we celebrate the return of Jesus the Word of God to the Father having achieved all that he was sent to do fulfilling the words of Scripture, "As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do" (Isaiah 55:10-11). By his life, death and resurrection, the Lord has returned to the Father having watered the earth with the well-spring of eternal life and providing the seed for the rich harvest of the children of God. He has taken with him his glorified human nature into the sanctuary of heaven itself, "so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf" (cf. Hebrews 9:24) until God's kingdom is fully revealed and we shall see him face to face once more.

But the Lord has not left us orphans. He told his disciples to return to Jerusalem and wait for the power that he and his Father will send, the power of the Holy Spirit who alone is able to unite the diverse harvest of God's children, blowing wherever the Spirit wills and touching many all at once down the ages, transforming the consciousness or souls of God's children to know and experience the truth of God, the truth of what it means to be human and the truth about the right relation between the divine and the human. It is no wonder, then, that the Holy Spirit is called the "Soul" of the Church (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, #813) for the Spirit is the living consciousness and source of power for believers in their witness of the Gospel.

In baptism, we have received the gift of God's Holy Spirit with the commission to witness to what God has done and continues to do until the Lord's return. Our witness is our mission. Our mission does not leave us "standing here looking into the sky". Rather, our mission requires us to get on with it and, in his name, to proclaim repentance for the forgiveness of sins until his return in the same way by which he has ascended to the Father.


