Your Parish Needs You!

Poor Wellington! It continues to be battered! Most recently it was battered by Nature. Gale force winds caused flights and ferry crossings to be cancelled, slips on the Remutaka Hill, sea waves to lash the coastal roads. So severe, in fact were the winds that the MetService warning was upgraded, for some time, to red, the highest warning possible.

But the city has been battered in recent times in other ways as well. Covid caused not only our bodies but also our minds, our work, our family connections to be battered. Then a wave of restructuring battered the government departments increasing unemployment in a sector which is part of the bed rock of our local economic life.

Winds the parish can survive. But the parish can't survive without you. Covid, restructuring, the normal movement of people out of the city have all lessened the number of parishioners serving as readers, eucharistic ministers, altar servers, even committee members. Today I would like you to consider becoming more active in the life of the parish. I would especially like the younger members of our parish – high school and university students, young workers - to consider this call to volunteer. You don't have to be retired to volunteer. After all, Jesus was only about 33 years old when he died on the cross for us! And some of his apostles would have been younger than that!

A practical example: many have been asking about the possibility of sharing in the chalice at communion time. This is simply not possible at the moment. Not for health reasons related to Covid but for practical reasons. We do not have enough Ministers of the Eucharist! At each mass we normally have the priest and four ministers of the Eucharist distributing the consecrated hosts. To facilitate a dignified yet expeditious distribution of host and chalice we would need another four ministers besides the four already mentioned. In other words, about eight ministers per mass. To repeat: we just don't have enough parishioners volunteering for such ministry.

All you have to do to volunteer is to make yourself known to one of the priests or to Sr. Frances after mass, or contact Abby in the office by phone or email, and we will gladly help you learn your role.

To adapt the words of President John F. Kennedy, "Ask not what your parish can do for you, rather ask what you can for your parish!"

Thank you for considering this plea and offering to serve as a minister or work on a committee in your parish.

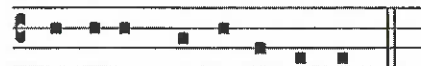
