

Young Families Under Pressure

The annual budget of the Government. The closing of two Catholic primary schools in the Archdiocese of Wellington. Quite different realities!

Both made the news this past week. The first, the Government budget, drew much interest and much commentary; the second, the closing of two Catholic primary schools, drew far less attention and comment. Yet both, in different ways, can place pressure on the dreams and aspirations of young Catholic families just starting out on their life together.

Some may be surprised that I mention 'young families in this parish'. For so long many of us have looked around the church on a Sunday morning or early evening and wondered where all the young have gone, where are the young families. Well, I invite you to look again when you settle down in the pew for Sunday mass! With a fresh glance you will perhaps notice that there are many more young people and young families now attending Sunday masses.

Young people studying or working in Wellington are sitting in the pews wanting to connect or reconnect with a community that speaks of hope that their world cannot give. And young families, who cherish a deep connection to the Church, also wish their babies, their toddlers and their youngsters to grow up with that same hope.

Pressure can mount very quickly on young families. Careful and prudent planning for a bright future can easily be upset. Unwelcome cuts in Government budgets can unexpectedly oblige parents to trim important, even essential, expenses here and there. Valued opportunities for nourishing the Faith disappear when Catholic schools close. And so, in small, incremental ways pressure mounts. Dreams begin to fade. Family life can become a burden, not a joy.

Such pressure can bring stress and tension. Stress and tension can eventually overwhelm, create a sense of loneliness and isolation. Being able to come together with others, share a coffee and chat about what is happening in their families may be all that is needed to work wonders and restore some inner balance and calm.

Is there a need for such a calming space in the lives of young families, particularly young mothers? Could St Mary of the Angels provide that space? Would you like to take part in such a space? Could you help?

I would be very interested to hear from you.




