

“The blessing cup that we bless is a communion with the Blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the Body of Christ” (cf. 1 Corinthians 10:17). “Communion” is union with Christ’s Body and Blood. To be united to him is to be one with his Body broken for others and his Blood poured out for others. This is the meaning of Christian sacrifice: we become what we eat and drink; bodies broken for others and blood poured out for others. How? We become bodies broken for others and blood poured out for others by our love and service.

And lest we forget, this love and service of others is not judged by their quantity but honoured by their quality. Nor is this love and service rated according to what is requited. After all, if we love only those who love us, what thanks can we expect? We are to love even if there is no hope of return (cf. Luke 6:32, 35). Our Christian sacrifice, then, is the fruits of our love and service. Adoration of Christ’s Body and Blood without the fruits of love and service would make a mockery of what we eat and drink.

So, in the words of the fourth century bishop and saint, Cyril of Jerusalem, “*Coming up to receive, then, do not have your wrists extended or your fingers spread, but make your left hand a throne for the right, for it is about to receive a King, and cupping your palm, receive the Body of Christ, and answer ‘Amen’... After partaking of the Body of Christ, approach also the cup of his Blood...*” This is the “King” we receive, with whom we commune.

By this Holy Communion, we hold firm to what we have received: “For this is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, ‘This is my Body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me’. In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, ‘This cup is the new covenant in my Blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me’” (cf. 1 Corinthians 11:23-25).




## Jim Meachen Bequest
