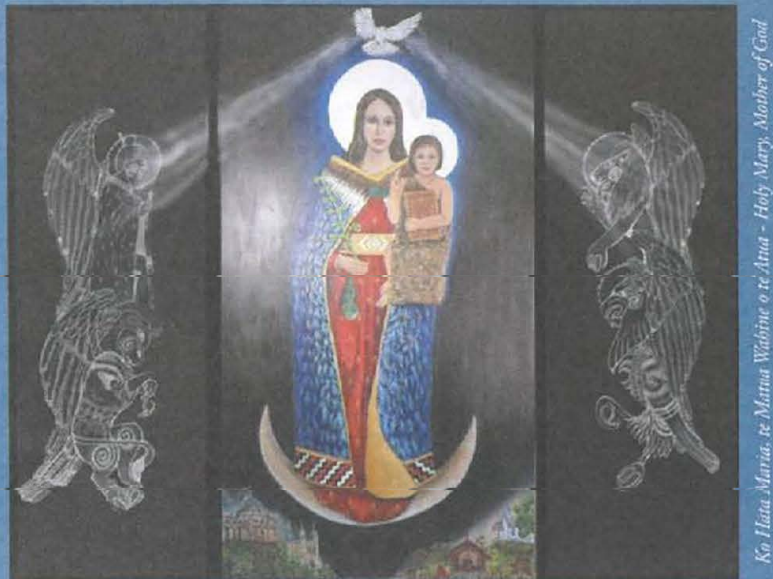

Prayer and Hospitality

May you be strengthened by your personal time with the Master and may that move you to be more hospitable to those who cross your path and whatever comes your way.

Some people would see both a connection and an opposition in the Readings of today. The theme of hospitality is seen in the way that Abraham, (his wife and household) and Martha respond to their respective visitors. The contrasting attitudes of Martha and Mary as one serves, the other sits. In Colossians Paul mentions the driving force that enables him to see his sufferings as ways of serving the Lord and proclaiming the Good News. The person who is aware of what a relationship with God is about, will act in a hospitable caring way towards all. They will experience God's presence more fully.

The Gospel passage of Jesus being a guest in the house of Martha and Mary, we see that the two sisters have different responses to the presence of the Lord, Martha following the pattern of Sarah and Abraham, busying herself with the actions of hospitality. Mary takes a position of a disciple, sitting at the feet of Jesus, listening to His Word. Both women do what they think is appropriate in having a relationship with Jesus' presence with them.

Three things that are mentioned in today's Readings: Hospitality, Suffering, and Sitting at the feet of the Master. There are times when we probably have experienced these in our life. It is important that we offer hospitality to others either in word or action. It may mean going out of our comfort zone. Hopefully others will experience God's love for them in their lives, and we, God's presence that God is with us. Like Paul we may too experience hardships, insults, abuses by those who do not want to hear the message. God is with us through it all.

Mary sat at the feet of Jesus listening to His word. We too are invited to spend time and prayer each day at the Master's feet. This is the energy of keeping us going whatever our call is in life. Time with the Master helps us to deal with suffering and the needs to serve others. We must listen to His Word and reflect how we can apply it to our day.

The Word of the Lord, taken, digested linked to our daily lives, is the food and drink we must partake each and every day. Then we truly will live in the presence of the Lord.

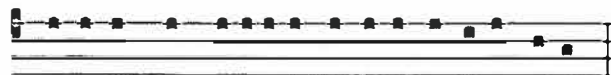

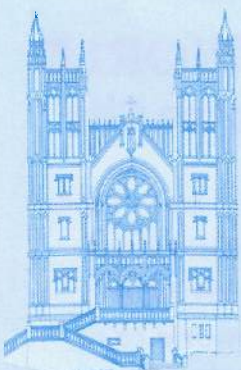
