

“God is love and those who live in love live in God, and God lives in them” (cf. 1 John 4:16). Since God is love, salvation is pegged to love. All who live in love are not lost because God lives in them. Christians do not have a monopoly on love. So, Christians are not the only ones who are saved!

In that case, what does Jesus mean when he says in our gospel reading today, “Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed”? What is this “narrow door”. The quick answer is “Faith in Jesus”. Well, yes but, you see, faith does not guarantee entry! Faith may get us to the narrow door, but faith is not a free pass! Why? Because it is Jesus who opens the door to us. After all, he is the gate (cf. John 10:9), so it is he who scrutinises those who may gain entry. It becomes a question of whether we pass his scrutiny, whether we pass muster?

In the words of our gospel reading, we may knock and say, “Lord, open to us”. But the Lord may answer, “I do not know where you come from”. We may remonstrate with him, “We once ate and drank in your company and taught in our streets” (Perhaps for us, an oblique or cryptic reference to Word and Sacrament?). However, as we know, external performances can mask the hypocrite or the wolf in sheep’s clothing. We may be fooled by the keeping up of appearances, but the Lord is not fooled. The Lord exposes the heart. So, God forbid, we hear him say to us, “I do not know where you come from. Away from me!” It is then that we, who thought ourselves first by our faith, will find ourselves not only last but also left out!

You see, faith may give us a privileged run to the narrow door. But obligation comes with privilege. Despite the privilege of faith, we are judged by the heart where the obligation to love is exposed. In opening the door to us, the God of love looks to recognise himself in us!

So, we are back where we started. Salvation is pegged to love. All who live in love are not lost because God lives in them; and, seeing himself in them, God cannot deny his own self (cf. 2 Timothy 2:13).


