We live in a computerized society we stress the value of planning and calculation. The computer helps the human mind to make quick and prudent decisions. Does calculation have a place in human relationships or on a way people decide to style their lives as related to God and religion?

It is not an easy religion that Jesus sets before the 'great crowds' that accompanied him on the way. 'Great Crowds' this means the ordinary people of every day life who have been willing to follow Him to the end. Most people have found His Gospel full of divine wisdom and human tenderness. But what can be said about the blunt language, demanding radical change? To prefer nothing to the love of Christ, not even the most legitimate bonds of affection, to take up one's cross and renounce everything in order to be His disciple, is that really reasonable? Certainly not! If we wish to be reasonable we shall never have those evangelical deeds of daring which mark the true disciple of Jesus. A world dominated by materialism, contemporary idols of power, sex, money, there is often need of heroism just to be Christian.

Jesus lays down clearly the conditions of becoming his disciples. He demands that we love him above everyone else and above anything in this world. We cannot serve both God and wealth, for we will love one and despise the other. Is it not true that many try to serve and love God and their wealth? God and their selfish ambitions? Some use God in order to attain material prosperity. Some preach so well that they can convince people to turn over to them a significant portion of their wealth. There are lukewarm disciples who might love Jesus but not whole heartedly. These are still attached to themselves and their prized possessions. They love Jesus a little for fear of having to lose themselves and the things they most value. They end up building their own kingdoms and not the kingdom of God, which Jesus zealously proclaimed in word and deed, even to the expense of his own life. The lukewarm love of disciples towards Jesus makes it difficult for them, if not impossible to carry their own crosses to follow him. We know for certain that those who are unwilling to suffer and die with and for Jesus cannot hope to share in His everlasting glory in Heaven.

Following Jesus is tough! There are lots of hassles along the way, but the blessings always outnumber them a hundred times. You think the yoke is heavy until you find out its easy. That is the grace.....and the joy of discipleship.


**R.** In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

## St Vincent de Paul

We at Wellington City St Vincent de Paul want to thank everyone who supports us with prayers, volunteering on foodbank collection days, gifting food, and making donations through our QR code. This helps to reflect Christ in our world. Here's a short summary of our past year's work.

Our core activity is visiting and spending time with people who are lonely, hospitalised, or housebound in our area. In the last twelve months we made 311 visits. In addition, we delivered 234 food parcels to people in need; furnished and provided moving assistance for 31 households, mostly for refugee families; provided financial support for schools to assist students in need with the cost of uniforms, school supplies, and school activity fees (an increased need with job-losses in our area); collected 90 boxes of food donated by customers at the Newtown New World supermarket; hosted 25 morning teas for residents of social housing; provided clothing, household goods, and bedding for many people in need. Your support helps to make a difference in our city, especially in these cold days of winter.
