

Who would have thought the following had faith to move mountains?

The thief on the cross who said, “Jesus, remember me”, the desperate father who cried out, “I do have faith! Help the little I possess!”, the leper who asked, “Lord, if you want to, you can cure me”, or the woman who covered Jesus’ feet with her tears, wiping them away with her hair. Yet, their mustard seed-sized faith was able to move the mulberry tree-sized power of God: the thief gained paradise, the father saw his son cured, the leper was cleansed, and the woman had her many sins forgiven because of her great love. These examples should make us re-assess what it means to “Increase our faith”.

“Increase” can be such a misguided word to use in phrases like “Increase in faith” or “Increase in grace”. Why? Because “increase” easily smacks of quantity. So-and-so has greater faith than I and is, therefore, closer to God. So-and-so has more grace than I and is, therefore, higher up the ladder of sanctity. But how do we judge what is “more” or “higher”? Broader phylacteries, longer tassels, places of honour, babbling words in the hope that God will hear? Surely, when God’s Spirit is at work, God is fully present, and not some fragmented “bit” of God at work. So, “increase” can result in a ‘wonky’ understanding when used in phrases like “Increase in faith” or “Increase in grace”. You see, the mystery and paradox of God is the mystery and the paradox of love, since God is love. How does one quantify love? *Can* love be quantified at all?

Living the Gospel is our basic duty as servants of God. Our witness *is* our duty. So, by living the Gospel we are doing nothing more than our duty. But the quality of that witness? Ah, well, that’s another matter. What is certain is that the quality of our witness cannot be quantified like stacking up loyalty cards or piling up graces in some heavenly ‘piggy bank’.

And, so, we return to how we began this rumination: How did the people mentioned above move the mulberry tree-sized power of God by their mustard seed-sized faith? What defines quality over quantity? If nothing else, the question should give us pause should we ever apply the word “increase” to the theological virtues of faith, hope and love.




