

## Perseverance in Prayer

Our Gospel theme today is 'Persistence in Prayer': pray without ceasing, pray without losing heart. Jesus tells his disciples: pray always without becoming weary. Today he tells us a parable, of the corrupt judge.

He said: *"there was a judge in a certain town who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, 'I want justice from you against my enemy!' for a long time he refused, at last he said to himself 'maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her rights, or she will persist on coming and worry me to death'.*

Jesus taught his disciples how to pray as he teaches us in the 'Our Father'. Much of our prayer is based on petition, a good form of prayer. We are coming to the Lord with our needs, as a child comes to its parent. Perseverance is not about changing God's mind, but changing ourselves and our relationship with God.

What Jesus does in this parable gives us an idea of God's justice by telling us that even the grumbling judge gets round to helping a poor widow, if only because he is ground down by the constant requests. The ingredient that is missing between the judge and the relentless woman is infinite love.

The 'delay' Jesus speaks of is not necessarily a delay in the infinite eyes of God. The key to living in the presence of God is to trust in his love, beyond our capacity. Praying continually does not mean that we understand more than anyone else. Sometimes, all we can do is 'trust when we do not trust,' giving ourselves to him and praying to be enlightened. We live in the hope of our eyes being enlightened as well as our hearts. We can be sure they will not open in the way we imagine, and God won't affect this change in a prescribed way. He will surprise us.

We are encouraged to approach God with confidence because he is just and loving, unlike the unjust judge in the parable.

We ask for the grace through the Holy Spirit to come to the Lord each moment, to offer the most extraordinary and most mundane parts of our lives. To be open to his ways and to his call. In the end God decides what to give. Praying always helps us to remain faithful and persevering.
